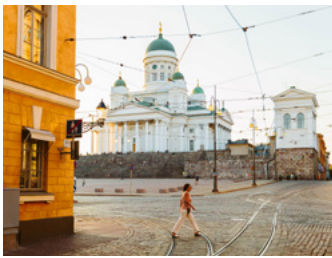

CLASSICS

1. Helsinki Cathedral & Senate Square

This Lutheran cathedral has been one of the most recognisable symbols of Helsinki and its silhouette since 1852.

2. Torikorttelit

These picturesque streets in the historic centre of Helsinki are lined with restaurants, cafés and local design shops.

3. Uspenski Cathedral

The largest Orthodox church in Northern and Western Europe features beautiful icons and paintings.

4. Esplanade Park

Relax, enjoy performances and go shopping in Finnish brand stores like Marimekko, Iittala & Arabia and Aarikka.

5. Market Square & Sightseeing Cruises (May–Sept)

Traditional open-air market selling local food and souvenirs. Sightseeing cruises depart from the waterfront.

6. Sibelius Monument & Park

The Sibelius Monument, sculpted by the artist Eila Hiltunen and unveiled in 1967, is dedicated to the Finnish composer Jean Sibelius.

7. Helsinki Olympic Stadium

Main venue of the 1952 Summer Olympics. Now hosts various events and includes a 72-metre tower, a visitor centre, and the Sports Museum of Finland, TAHTO.

CULTURE & ARCHITECTURE

8. Kamppi Chapel

This fine example of contemporary wood architecture offers a peaceful retreat in the heart of the city.

9. Helsinki Central Library Oodi

Oodi is an architecturally striking public venue that offers a vibrant space for reading, events, and creative gatherings.

10. Musiikkitalo

An acoustically first-class concert hall and the home of classical music in Helsinki. Musiikkitalo houses the Helsinki Philharmonic Orchestra, the Finnish Radio Symphony Orchestra and the Sibelius Academy.

11. Finlandia Hall

Designed by the legendary architect Alvar Aalto, Finlandia Hall is a renowned venue for congresses, concerts and events. The Finlandia Exhibition takes you on an experiential journey to the roots of Aalto family's creativity.

12. National Museum of Finland

Closed for renovation 2023–2027.

13. Tempelisaukio “Rock” Church

Built into solid rock, this unique Lutheran church was designed by the Suomalainen brothers and opened in 1969.

14. Finnish National Opera & Ballet

Home to Finland's leading opera and ballet company, offering diverse performances for all ages.

ART & DESIGN

15. Ateneum Art Museum

Finnish classics as well as international masterpieces.

16. Museum of Contemporary Art Kiasma

Kiasma offers contemporary and conceptual art from its own collections and from visiting artists.

17. Amos Rex

This art museum presents one of the most extensive private art collections in Finland alongside international contemporary exhibitions.

18. Helsinki Art Museum HAM

HAM maintains and exhibits the city's art collection. Modern and contemporary art.

19. Architecture & Design Museum Helsinki

The museum celebrates the story of Finnish architecture and design.

20. Kunsthalle Helsinki

In addition to contemporary art, the exhibition programme also includes design and architecture, as well as cross-disciplinary events.

21. Sinebrychoff Art Museum

Located in the beautiful home of Paul and Fanny Sinebrychoff, this museum houses mainly traditional European art.

22. Arabia Museum

Discover Arabia, one of the most celebrated Finnish design and lifestyle brands. The origins of the city lie in the neighbourhood. Trams 6 & 8.

SAUNAS

23. Allas Pool

Enjoy a relaxing swim and sauna session, a concert or a memorable dinner.

24. Uusi Sauna

This modern take on the traditional neighbourhood sauna combines a public sauna, bar and bistro.

25. Löyly

At Löyly you can experience traditional woodheated and smoke saunas, take a dip in the Baltic Sea and enjoy a meal with a lovely view.

26. Kotiharju Sauna

Opened in 1928, Kotiharju is a traditional wood-heated neighbourhood sauna that offers an authentic experience of Finnish sauna culture.

27. Sauna Hermann

Sauna Hermann is a traditional neighbourhood sauna founded in 1953.

FAMILY FUN

28. Helsinki City Museum

The museum offers new perspectives on the city's history and everyday life. Children's Town exhibition is popular among young visitors.

29. Paradox Museum

Tickle your mind for fun & take unforgettable holiday pictures.

30. Natural History Museum

This museum showcases the diversity of nature. A fascinating journey through Finland.

31. Korkeasaari Zoo

Korkeasaari Zoo was established in 1889 as an educational facility. Today, visitors can see animals such as lynx, brown bears, and Finnish forest reindeer. Bus 16.

32. Linnanmäki Amusement Park (Open May–Oct) & SEA LIFE Helsinki (Open all year)

The park's most popular attraction, the wooden roller coaster, was opened in 1951. In SEA LIFE aquarium you will encounter majestic rays, fierce sharks, and other underwater wonders.

SHOPPING & FOOD

33. Old Market Hall

Wide range of delicacies, several restaurants and cafés. Opened in 1889.

34. Hakaniemi Market Hall

Two floors of quality foods, homeware, gifts, cafés and restaurants.

35. Hietalahti Market Hall

Atmospheric café and restaurant hall offering a culinary journey around the world.

36. Stockmann Department Store

Classic department store with an excellent food market.

37. Kamppi Helsinki

Features a shopping centre, a long-distance & local bus terminal and food court Kortteli.

NATURE & OUTDOORS

42. Suomenlinna Sea Fortress

One of Finland's top attractions and a UNESCO World Heritage Site, offering guided tours, museums, restaurants, and events. Open year-round.

43. Vallisaari & Lonna Islands (waterbus May–Sep)

Vallisaari offers stunning views and nature as well as cafés and activities. Historical and charming Lonna has a restaurant and a public sauna.

44. Uunisaari Island

Restaurant, sauna and beach. Connection by pontoon bridge (Nov–April) or water bus (summer).

45. Pihlajasaari Island

Pihlajasaari (waterbus May–Aug) offers beautiful sand beaches, campfire sites, a camping area and a restaurant.

46. Töölönlahti Bay

Popular spot for jogging and summer hangouts. Find the Winter Garden at the northern end of the bay.

47. Kaisaniemi Botanic Garden

The outdoor garden and greenhouses of Kaisaniemi offer unique plant experiences throughout the year.

48. Seurasaari Island & Open-Air Museum

In Seurasaari (museum open May–Sep), all buildings have been brought in from various parts of the country. You can visit the island itself all year. Bus 24 or tram 4.

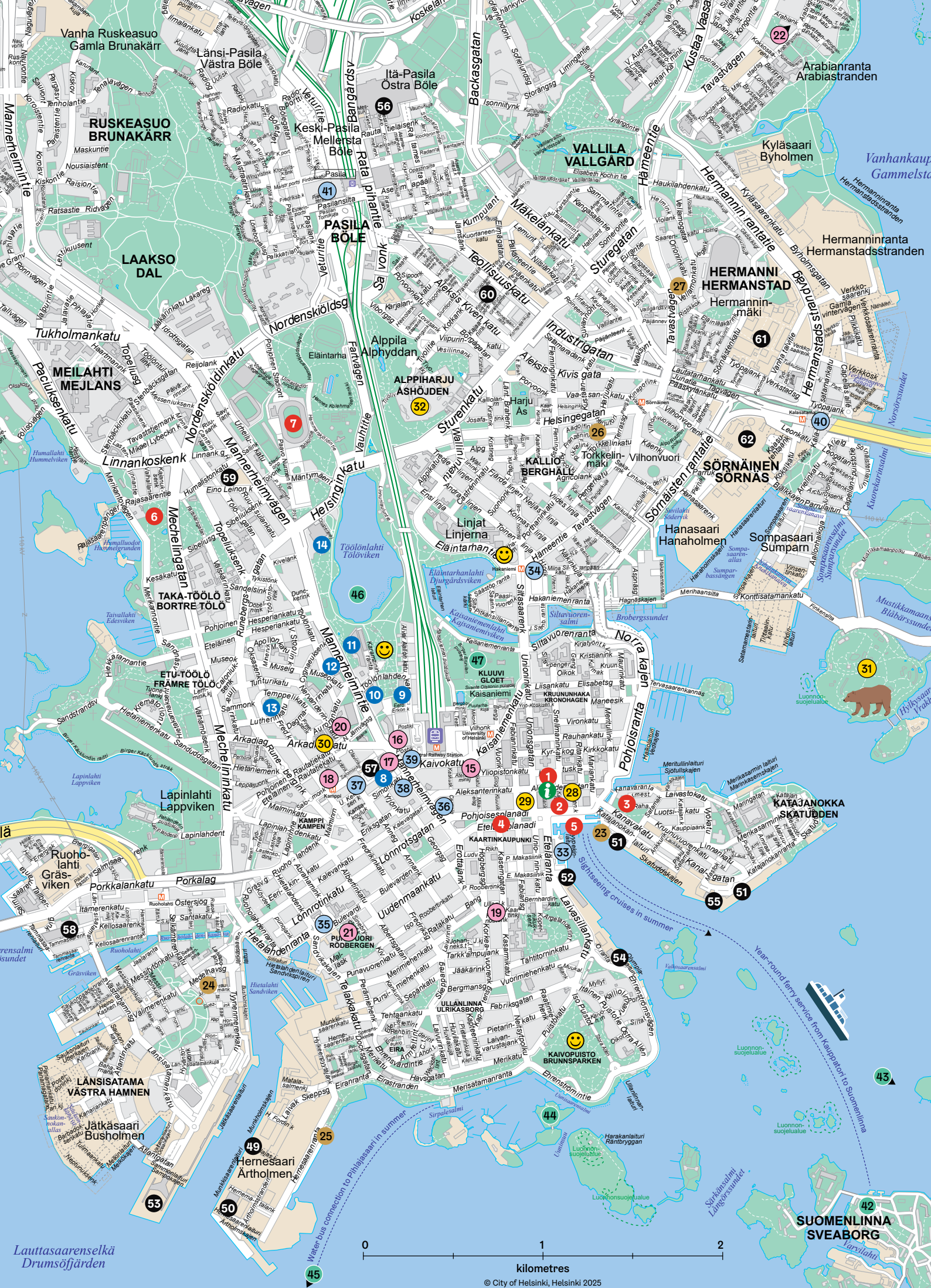

Getting Around

PUBLIC TRANSPORT



Buy your single ticket with contactless payment at card readers on public transport vehicles or at stations. Before boarding you can buy tickets from the HSL app, R-kiosk shops or HSL ticket machines.

- Drivers do not sell tickets!
- Day tickets for several days are available only in the HSL app!
- AB zones cover Helsinki city centre and suburbs.

You can use HSL trams, buses, the metro, commuter trains, light rail, and the Suomenlinna and Kruunuvuorenranta ferries with the same ticket.

Sightseeing: A great way to experience the city is to hop on tram 2 or 3.

Public ferry to Suomenlinna: The public ferry (HSL) to Suomenlinna operates all year round.

Water buses: During the summer, private water bus companies operate from the Market Square to the islands of Vallisaari, Suomenlinna and Lonna.

AIRPORT TRANSPORT

Buy a ticket for zones ABC!

Trains I and P: About 30 minutes from Central Railway Station.

Bus 600: About 45 minutes from Railway Square.

Taxis: Estimated cost from the city centre €45–65.

10 tips for sustainable travel in Helsinki

- Drink our excellent local tap water instead of bottled water.
- Explore the city on foot, by bike or by public transport.
- Choose services and attractions with sustainability labels, such as the Sustainable Travel Finland label.
- Use local travel services, such as guided walking and bicycle tours.
- Try local cuisine and drinks by visiting market halls, vegetarian or vegan restaurants, and restaurants that serve local and organic food.
- Enjoy nature and breathe in the fresh air: Helsinki offers plenty of parks, forests and seaside trails. There are also two national parks in the metropolitan area. Read more: vihreatsylit.fi/en
- When buying souvenirs, choose sustainable Finnish products like handcrafts (e.g. Lapuan Kankurit, Okra, U26 or Taito Shop). You can also visit one of the many flea markets or second-hand shops in town. Another great option is to donate money or your time, for example, to help protect the Baltic Sea: johnnurmisenosaatio.fi/en
- Recycle and sort waste while travelling whenever possible. Please recycle this map as paper!
- Broaden your horizons by visiting areas outside the city centre.
- Get to know the locals and their way of life. Visit market halls and squares, public saunas, or the Helsinki Central Library Oodi.
